

We hope you all had fun choosing your own mission last month and are ready for a new challenge. This month our Mission Focus is the Alliance Food Bank. In the past year and a half, things have changed a lot in our community. Donations have been received and people have been served. Yet, the food bank has had to be mindful of the necessity of keeping people safe during the pandemic while meeting the needs of those who are in need. As a result, at this time, while the food bank appreciates food donations, monetary donations would be a better option, but they are still willing to accept food item donations. In the past year, the number of families served has been consistent with 25 families (about 74 people) served each month. If you would like to donate to this ministry, please write "food bank" in the memo of your check. If you would like to bring food items, please bring them to the church by October 31st so we can deliver them to the food bank the following week.

The Mission Committee is also looking into applying for a John Calvin Presbytery COVID grant. This will help with the expenses of the food bank and other ministries of the Alliance of Churches, including utility assistance and Share Your Christmas meals. Thank you again for your generous support of mission throughout the year.
